You can choose to create a water lily or rose bud flower from your paper napkin.

WATER LILY

Unfold the paper napkin

1. Fold 4 corners to the centre
2. Repeat fold 4 corners to the centre
3. Repeat stage 2
4. Turn over and fold the 4 corners to the centre
5. Turn over and place on a glass and pull down each of the layers

Turn over your completed water lily.



ROSE BUD

Unfold the paper napkin

1. Fold in half as a triangle
2. Roll up from the long edge leaving about 2 inches unrolled
3. Turn over and roll up from the corner
4. Tuck in loose end
5. Spread out the 2 tails, one either side as leaves.

Book Group News




